

2025 Legislative Priority

The Washington Wildlife and Recreation Coalition is Washington's chief advocate for local conservation and recreation projects across the state. For 30 years, we have been the steadfast champion for the Washington Wildlife & Recreation Program (WWRP), joining diverse voices for our great outdoors. In addition to the WWRP, we support select other legislative efforts to increase recreation and habitat lands and ensure equitable access for all Washingtonians.

\$150 Million for Washington Wildlife & Recreation Program

- The Coalition asks the Legislature for \$150 Million for the WWRP in the 2025-27 Capital Budget for outdoor recreation and conservation projects around the state.
- Use of Washington's outdoor spaces is at an all time high, as state
 residents raced for outdoor spaces to have safe, healthy fun during
 the COVID19 pandemic. With demand for outdoor recreation still
 rising and the state's population continuing to grow, acquiring new
 spaces and increasing services and maintenance is critical to keep
 them safe and well maintained.
- The WWRP grant program is crucial for conservation across the state to preserve habitat and mitigate the environmental impact of our growing population and the rise in usage of parks, trails and natural spaces due to outdoor recreation. We must take care of the ecosystems that sustain us, and provide funding for restoration for the future of Washington's outdoors.
- Investment is critical for our economy, for our environment, for working lands, and for critical fish and wildlife habitat around the state.



Additional 2025 Legislative Priorities

State Tribal Recreation Impacts Inititiative

- This initiative is a partnership between the Department of Fish and Wildlife, Department of Natural Resources, State Parks, the Governor's office and federally recognized tribes in Washington State.
 The group is working towards co-developing recreation management tools that coordinate stewardship of natural and cultural resources effectively and protect Tribal rights on statemanaged lands and waters.
- Our support is for total of \$7.4 Million in Operating funding aimed to support this effort divided among the following packages:
 - The Governor's Office of Indian Affairs Budget Request (\$3,735,000)
 - Including tribal capacity grants; facilitation and intermediary services; and annual in-person leadership and information sharing meetings.
 - DFW Invest in Lands Stewardship (\$1,891,000 / 4.0 Full Time Employee)
 - State Parks Tribal State Lands Stewardship (\$818,000 / 1.8 Full Time Employee)
 - DNR Rec Lands/Cultural Resources CFL (\$635,000 / 1.6 Full Time Employee)

Recreation and Conservation Office Technical Assistance

- The Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) has been working on developing a technical
 assistance program to better serve the whole of Washington with regards to their grant programs.
 Hiring a dedicated staff member to fulfill this role will better accomplish the goals and identify
 future work as well.
- This work has been tracked by the Coalition and is a step in addressing the recommendations of the Equity review of RCO's grant programs.
- We support the ask for \$266k Operating Ongoing Funds for a Full Time Employee in this capacity.

Department of Fish and Wildlife Lands Stewardship

- The Coalition supports funding for the \$10m Operating (\$13m Ongoing) request in funds towards DFW's Invest in Land Stewardship package.

Department of Natural Resources Natural Areas Program

Other Outdoor Grant Programs

- No Child Left Inside (NCLI) provides under-served youth with opportunities to experience the
 outdoors, often at WWRP-funded parks. The Coalition supports WWRC partners in requesting \$7m
 operating ongoing funds (\$4.5M carryforward and \$2.5m additional)
- Youth Athletic Facilities (YAF) provides funds for outdoor athletic facilities for youth sports. We support the \$27m Capital Budget request.
- Aquatic Lands Enhancement Account (ALEA) provides funds for the acquisition, improvement, or protection of aquatic lands and waterfront access. We support the \$7.4m Capital Budget request.
- Farmland Protection and Land Access Program (FPLA) provides funds for agricultural conservation easement funding. We support the \$4m Capital Budget request.
- <u>Community Forests Program</u> provides funds for forestland preservation. We support the \$31m
 Capital Budget Request.
- <u>Community Outdoor Athletics Facilities</u> provides funds for building, expanding, and renovating athletic facilities. We support the \$17m Capital Budget Request.

Trust Land Transfer

- The Coalition supports funding for the \$30m Capital request in funds towards Trust Land Transfer 2025-2026 projects.
